Have been wanting to write to you ever since last month, but was prevented by way businesses which I have to perform, but as I have time this morning, so I sit down, to write and tell you all what is going on, between me and German Baron Von Soden. I often hear from my countrymen who have visited Germany that you the people of Germany, especially you the Government are very kind and honest to we black men, but I am very, very sorry to say that Governor Soden is not so with me or rather the people, therefore I am now going to inform you in this letter all what I am suffering from him and I humbly beg you to take a deep consideration into this matter which I am about to relate.

10<sup>th</sup> Please try all you can in your power to move me out of these painful troubles. I am very, very sorry to add that, if things do not become better than what they are at present, I, and the whole country will go and settle in a far off country <u>where I can live</u> free, without the annoyance of Governor Soden because I have no power

to turn you, the German Government out of my country.

If you don't believe that all what I state in this letter are true, call Governor Soden and I to appear before you, in Germany. I can come, and repeat everything again before you, in the presence of Governor Soden. With kindest regard I am
